Unlike simple e-signature services, FORCS provides a complete digital document lifecycle infrastructure that integrates with existing enterprise systems, including ERP, CRM, and legacy databases.

The company will leverage its partnership with regional integrator Wavetec to address local requirements in the banking and government sectors. “Middle Eastern enterprises require sophisticated software solutions that can handle complex digital document workflows while maintaining compliance,” noted a regional industry analyst. “Korean software vendors with proven enterprise deployments meet these criteria.”
